PATA to hold tourism mart in Nepal

The Pacific Asia Travel Association (PATA) is organising its Adventure Travel and Responsible Tourism Conference and Mart (AT&RTCM) in Pokhara, western city of Nepal on February 7-11.

"Aware, socially concerned and linked to vast social networks, they seek sustainable travel experiences and are early adopters of responsible travel habits."


