

Entry requirements

- Honours degree in a relevant subject
- Applicants with an ordinary degree or other qualification and at least three years' relevant work experience will also be considered
- Applicants with formal qualifications below the level of HND who possess substantial experience in an appropriate field or have demonstrated exceptional abilities may also be admitted to the course

Study Mode

How will I study my course?

Full time or part time

You will study this course in the Highlands, supported in your learning via the UHI Virtual Learning Environment (VLE). Some of the optional modules will be delivered online and/or via video conferencing (VC). The entire course can also be studied at a distance, using the suite of online support materials and integrated remote learning technologies.

How long will my course last?

Full time (MSc): 18 months @ 35 hours per week

Part time (MSc): 2 to 3 years @ 12 to 18 hours per week

Part time (PgDip): 2 years @ 12 to 18 hours per week

Part time (PgCert): 1 year @ 12 to 18 hours per week

Number of hours per week indicates the total number of hours you should dedicate to the course, which includes time spent in lectures and individual study.
